

Feast of Divine Mercy: Divine Mercy Sunday



“This Feast emerged from the very depths of My mercy, and it is confirmed in the vast depths of My tender mercies. Every soul believing and trusting in My mercy will obtain it” (Diary 420).

Jesus told St. Faustina that on the Feast of Mercy “All the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened” (Diary 699).

Image of Divine Mercy




Jesus said, “Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and then throughout the world” (Diary 47).

He told St. Faustina, “I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over it’s enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory” (Diary 48).

Jesus told St. Faustina, “My gaze from this image is like My gaze from the cross” (Diary 326).

Chaplet of Divine Mercy



Jesus told St. Faustina, “Say unceasingly the chaplet that I have taught you. Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy” (Diary 687).

Jesus also told St. Faustina, “My daughter, encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given to you. It pleases Me to grant everything they ask of Me by saying the chaplet. When hardened sinners say it, I will fill their souls with peace, and the hour of their death will be a happy one” (Diary 1541).

Novena of Divine Mercy

Saint Faustina wrote in her Diary: “The Lord told me to recite the chaplet for the nine days before the Feast of Mercy. It is to begin on Good Friday. Then he told me: "By this novena (of Chaplets) I will grant every possible grace to souls". (Diary 197)



“On each day you will bring to My Heart a different group of souls, and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy, and I will bring all these souls into the house of My Father. You will do this in this life and in the next. I will deny nothing to any soul whom you will bring to the fount of My mercy. On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My bitter Passion, for graces for these souls” (Diary 1207).



Hour of Mercy

At three o' clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy. In this hour, I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion (Diary, 1320).

As often as you hear the clock strike the third hour, immerse yourself completely in My mercy, adoring and glorifying it; invoke its omnipotence for the whole world, and particularly for poor sinners; for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul. In this hour you can obtain everything for yourself and for others for the asking; it was the hour of grace for the whole world — mercy triumphed over justice. (1572)

My daughter, try your best to make the Stations of the Cross in this hour, provided that your duties permit it; and if you are not able to make the Stations of the Cross, then at least step into the chapel for a moment and adore, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, My Heart, which is full of mercy; and should you be unable to step into the chapel, immerse yourself in prayer there where you happen to be, if only for a very brief instant.
