Then we pray based on any message or event from the apparitions of Our Lady:

Blessed Mother, in your first apparition you immersed the children in the light that comes from God. The little shepherds remained immersed or penetrated by a light emanating from your virginal hands, which Lucia described as: "Our Lady opened her arms for the first time, communicating a very intense light, like a reflection coming from her hands, penetrating deep into our chest and our souls, allowing us to see ourselves in God, who was that light, more clearly than seeing ourselves in the best of mirrors." That light that penetrated in the depths of the souls of the children seemed to have been like a flash of the light of God that allowed them to experience a taste of heavenly joy. That light dissipated all of the darkness of the heart to open them to listen to the voice of the Mother in Heaven, to obey Her desires and to dispose

themselves with enthusiasm and courage to fulfill everything that She asked of them.

We pray, Blessed Mother, that from your maternal hands and through the intercession of the little shepherds, we may be like them, imbued with the light of God, so that any darkness that comes from sin, vice, obstinacy, indifference, laziness or skepticism, or from diabolical forces that assault our world, may be dissipated from our life, our heart, mind, sentiments and actions. Filled with the light of God, we may dispose ourselves to be Apostles of your Immaculate Heart so that with our prayers, sacrifices, rosaries, penances, consecration and propagation of devotion to your Immaculate Heart, we may cooperate daily so that soon we may see the full realization of the much yearned triumph of your Immaculate Heart.

 the sufferings of all individual human beings,
 laden with the sufferings of whole societies.
 Help us with the power of the Holy Spirit to conquer all sin:
